MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 14, 2008

The meeting was called to order by President Judy Tipton-Rush, who welcomed everybody attending. She began our meeting by reading the statement of purpose of the Arkansas Quilters' Guild.

Minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the previous newsletter.

Karla Edgar, program chair, described upcoming programs. Sharon Schamber will be here in February (her visit is paid for by the Cory Wilminster Fund), Wilma Richter will do a program in March, and Debbie Haley in April. Ginny Eckley, a national teacher, will be here in May, and Cynthia England, another national teacher, will be here in September.

Karla resigned as program chair, stating that she's had some health problems this year. Judy Tipton-Rush thanked her for her hard work, and led the guild in applause for a job well done. Carol Ann Wilbourn has agreed to take her place.

Treasurer Nancy Hicks reported that we have a \$10,000 CD that has been rolled over. We have \$19,834.26 in total assets as of December 31, 2007. Our net income in December was \$1,380.39. It was moved and seconded that AQG accept the treasurer's report.

Kelley Davis, AWOL co-chair with Rita Barnes, discussed plans for AWOL (Arkansas Women on the Loose). AWOL will be held at the C.A. Vines Arkansas 4-H Center on March 21-22. Bring any quilting problems you'd like help with, and a project or projects to work on. Judy Tipton-Rush, Pat Eaton, Carol Ann Wilbourn, and Georgia Manning will be doing some fun demos. We can begin to arrive any time after 1 p.m. on March 21, and leave by 5 p.m. on March 22. Don't forget your loud socks for our sock contest.

Wilma Richter, Challenges chair, passed out patterns for the March block challenge. This is a paper-pieced pattern. Use pastels, and a pink in the four assigned pieces. Two different techniques for paper piecing will be demonstrated at the February meeting. Blocks can be signed or not, and one or two lucky people will get to take all the blocks home in March.

Lavern Schaap introduced members of the Demo Team – Julie McAdoo, Betty Bradford, Desi Gipson, and Lavern. She said that they're planning to have several demos at each meeting, and urged everyone to come early, have fun, and learn a new technique. Upcoming demos are two methods of paper piecing,

cutting perfect circles, using a rotary cutter and ruler, and smocked ornaments.

They also plan an "Ask the Guild" spot, where everybody can ask for help with a quilting problem. If the person manning that table can't answer, they'll suggest someone else.

Debbie Haley and Kelley Davis are fund raising co-chairs. Debbie presented some options for fund raising for the coming year. Luggage tags with Quilt Lover and Stolen from the Arkansas Quilters' Guild on them are inexpensive, and available in several colors. Some pens printed with quilt designs. These are available with several messages that will change every time the user clicks the pen. She suggested the guild name, meeting date and time, and meeting place.

Nancy Hicks showed two almost completed quilts for the Heroes project, where the Guild gives a quilt to the family of each service person from Arkansas killed in the Afghanistan/Iraq War. Julie McAdoo will quilt them. Nancy also passed out kits for the appliqué of a Liberty Bell design for the next set.

SHINING SUNFLOWER

Piec-lique Curved Piecing 6 hour class

Curved seams have always been used in quilting. Until now they have been for the more advanced quilter. This class teaches you an easy and accurate way of sewing curved seams. Using this very contemporary design to explore this technique.



Supplies and Equipment Needed

Sewing machine (you won't need your sewing machine until in the afternoon)

Quarter inch piecing foot

A single needle plate for your sewing machine

Size 75 machine embroidery needles

Mettler size 50/3 cotton thread (beige or gray) for piecing

Basic sewing kit

Hard pressing mat

Regular spray starch (no spray sizing)

Freezer paper

Small stencil brush (1/2 inch)

Water soluble basting glue

Permanent marking pen

Surgical tweezers

Scissors (paper and fabric scissors)

Iron (You will need your own. The only one that I find is hot enough to work is a Rowenta travel iron.

You will need to purchase one. A must, no other iron works.)

Fabrics

Fat quarter of 8 different yellows

Fat quarter of 2 different reds

Fat quarter of 2 different dark green or dark browns

20" by 34" piece of 100% cotton batting

(Use your imagination on the colors you choose. The brighter the better.)

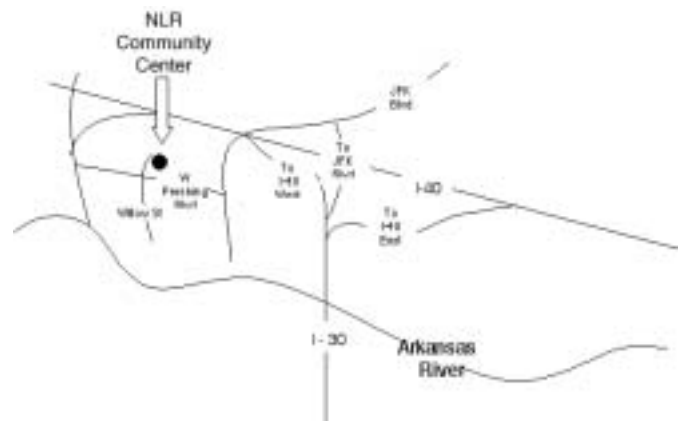
